

# Flitter Dance

This popular tune is used for a dance of the same on the Isle of Man.

Flitter Dance was traditionally danced on Good Friday, when shellfish were collected and cooked for breakfast on a fire, down by the beach. In the 1st part of the dance, the dancers stamp their feet and this represents the stamping out of the last of the live embers from the fire.

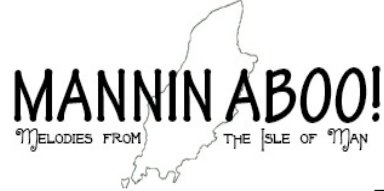
